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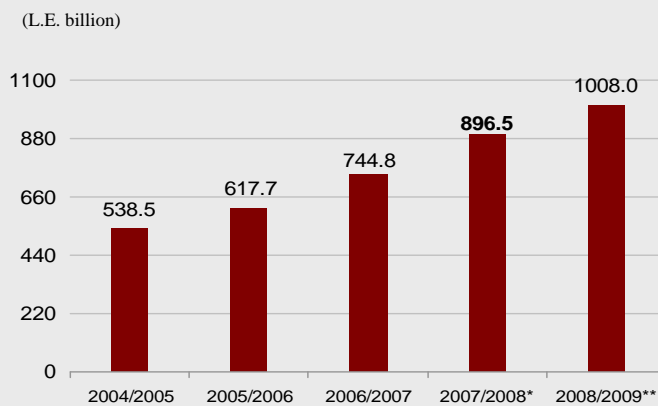
Major Economic and Social Indicators

-  Implemented investments increased by about 3.6% during the period (October – December) 2008 to reach L.E. 52.5 billion, compared to L.E. 50.7 billion during the same period of the previous year.
-  Annual inflation rate reached 13.5% in February 2009, compared to 12.1% during the same month of the previous year.
-  The net international reserves increased by about 0.6%, to reach about US \$ 33.1 billion in February 2009, compared to US \$ 32.9 billion during the same month of the previous year.
-  Total deposits in the banking sector “except CBE” increased by about 8.4%, to reach about L.E. 779.2 billion in January 2009, compared to L.E. 719 billion in the same month of the previous year.
-  The number of established companies operating by virtue of law 159/1981 and law 8/1997 decreased by about 23.7% during the period (October – December) 2008, compared to the same period of the previous year.
-  Total domestic debt increased by about 7.8%, to record L.E. 722.7 billion in December 2008, compared to L.E. 670.6 billion during the same month of the previous year.
-  Total Labor force increased by about 5.5%, to reach 24.8 million during the period (July – September) 2008, compared to 23.5 million during the same period of the previous year.
-  Unemployment Rate reached 8.6% during the period (July – September) 2008, compared to 9% during the same period of the previous year.

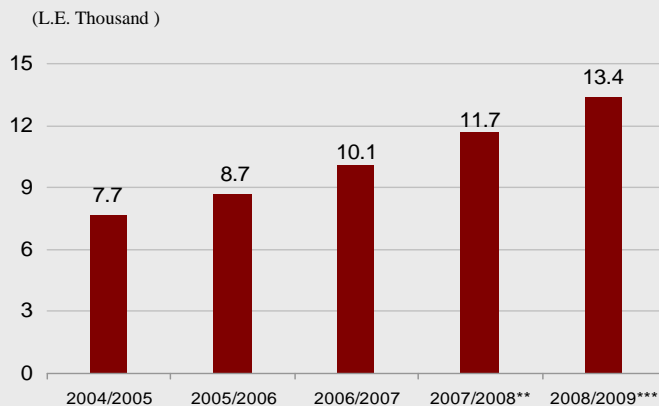
GDP “at market and current prices”

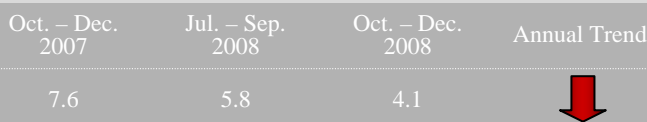
Average per capita real income*
(2004/2005 – 2008/2009)



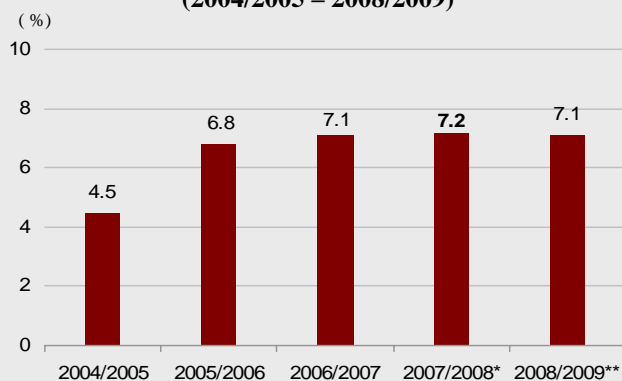

(%)



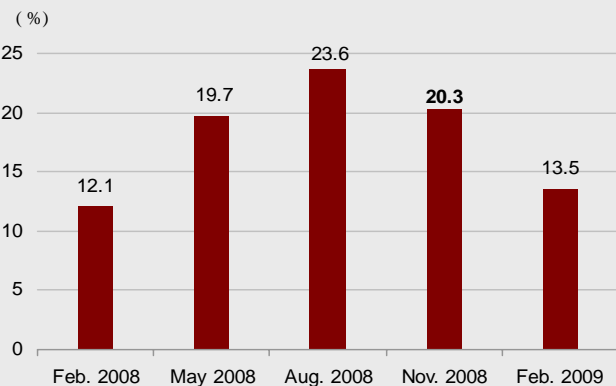

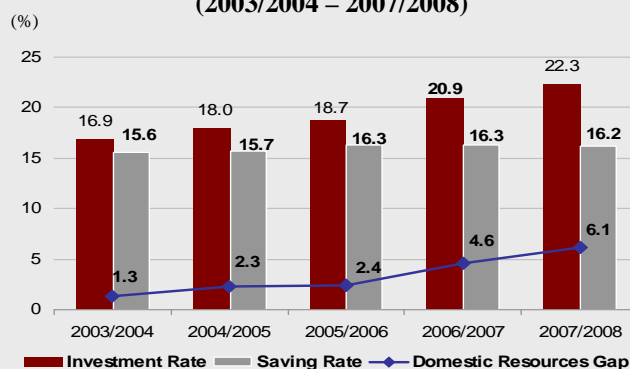

Implemented investments reached L.E. 52.5 billion in the second quarter of year 2008/2009, achieving 3.6% increase compared to the same quarter of the previous year.

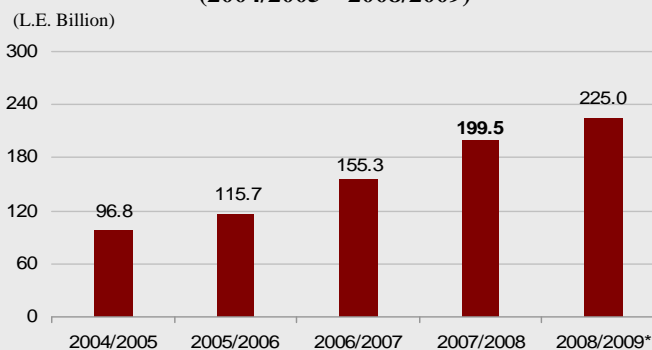
Investment rate decreased to reach 21.4% - as a percentage of GDP - during the second quarter of year 2008/2009, compared to about 23% during the same quarter of the previous year.

Private sector investments decreased by about 4.3% during the second quarter of year 2008/2009, to reach L.E. 35.3 billion (which represents 67.2% of the total implemented investments), compared to about L.E. 36.9 billion (which represents 72.8% of the total implemented investments) during the same quarter of the previous year.

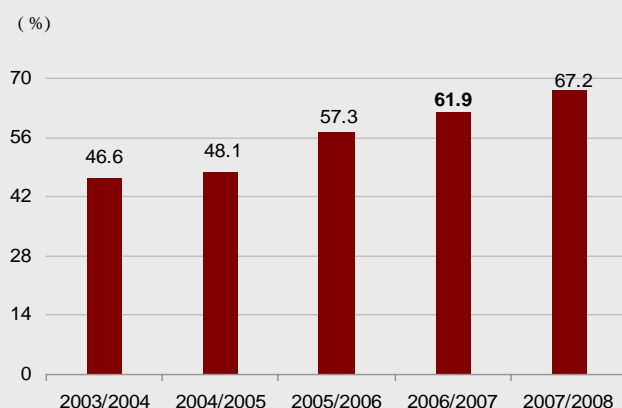

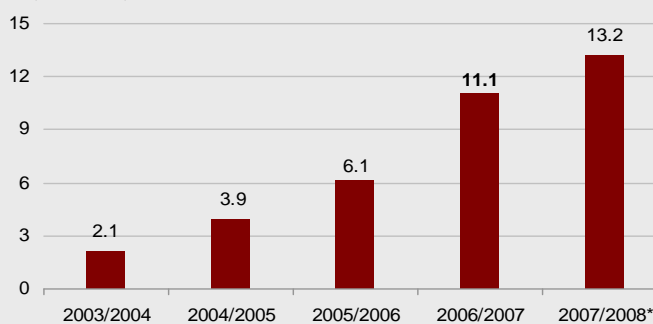

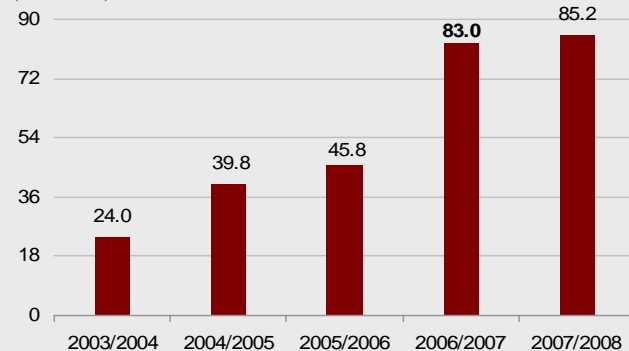

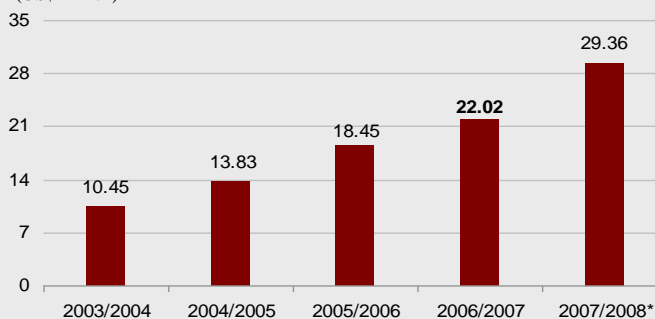

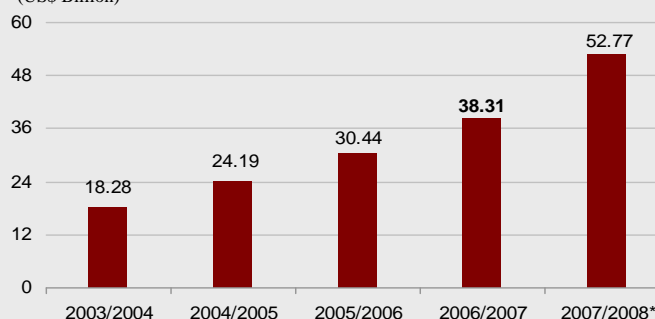

Net Trade Balance

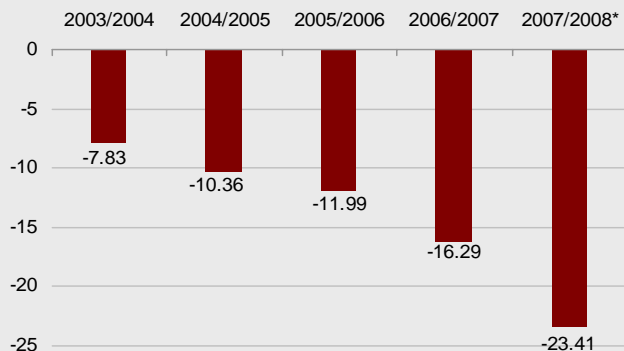

Current Account Balance

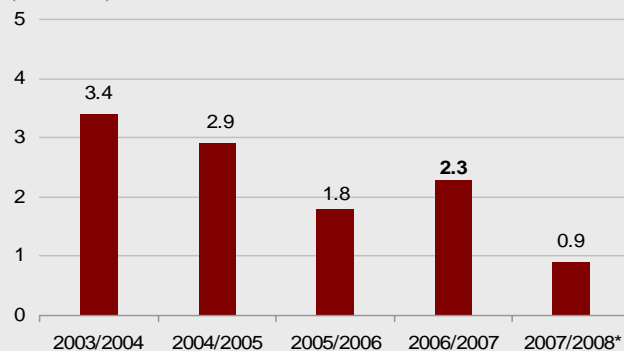

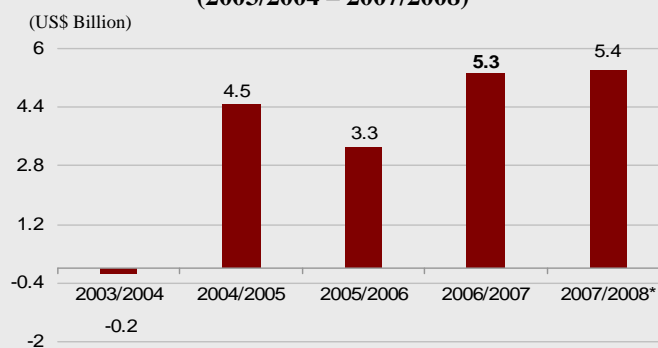
Balance of Payments Account

Deficit in the balance of payments amounted to about US\$ one billion during the period (October - December) 2008 compared to a deficit amounted to about US\$ 1.9 billion during the same period of the previous year.

Increase in the petroleum exports to reach US\$ 14.5 billion in 2007/2008 compared to about US\$ 10.1 billion in 2006/2007.

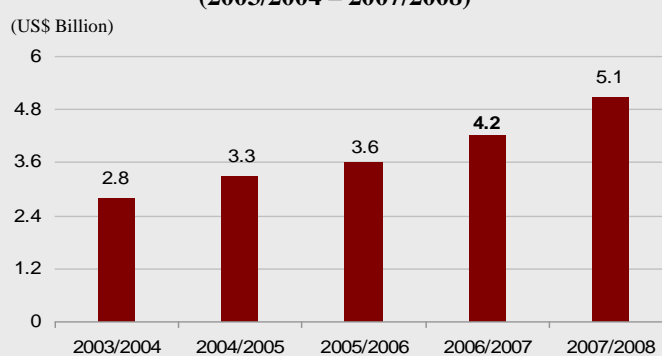

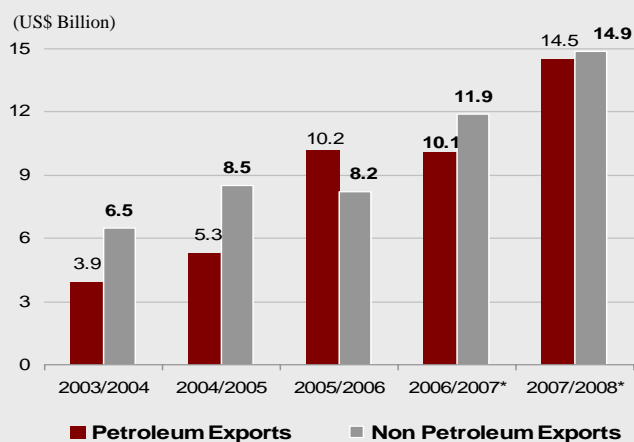

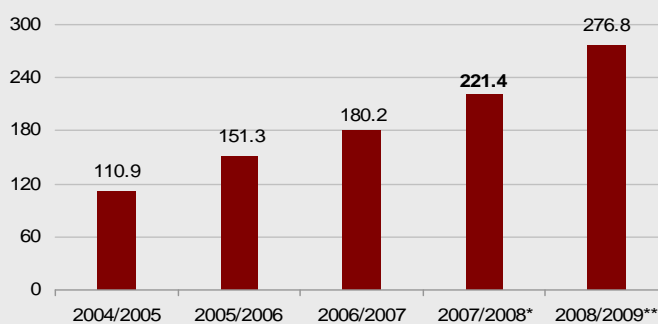

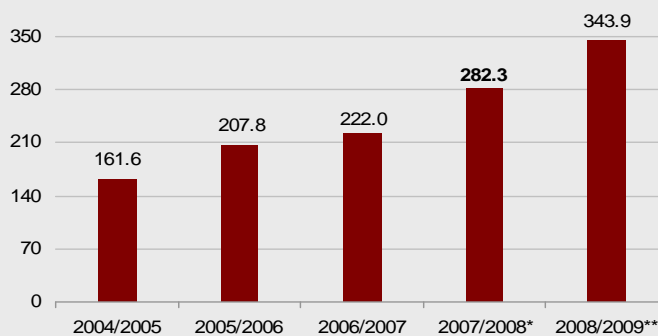

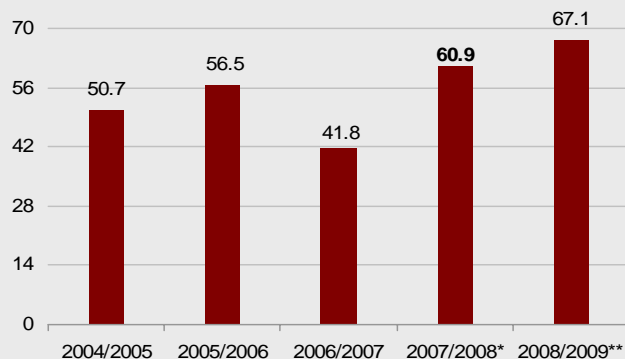

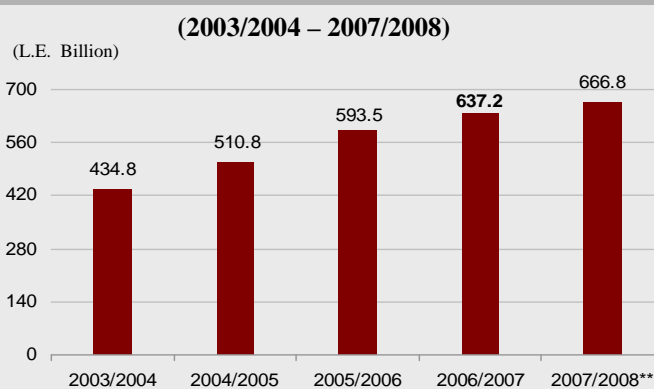

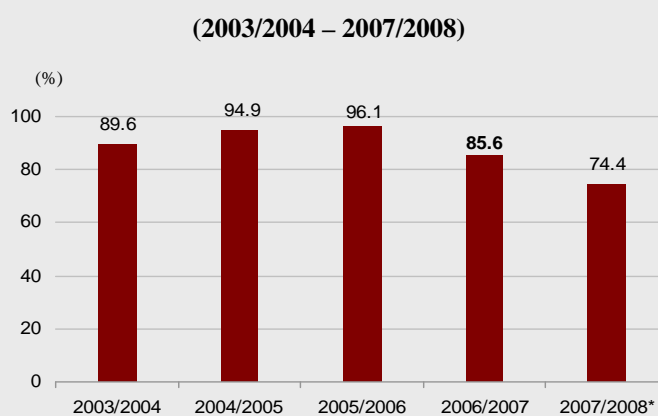

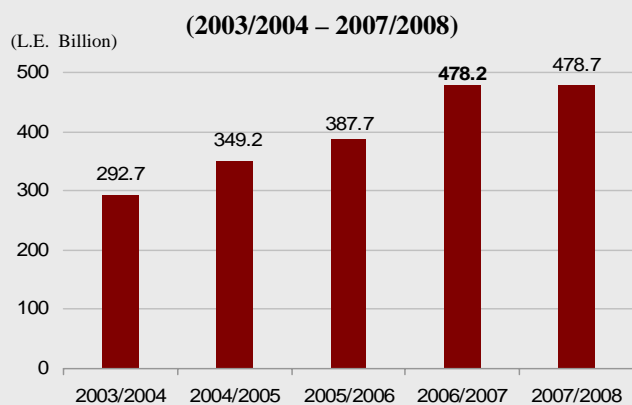

Government Domestic Debt (December 2007 – December 2008) (L.E. Billion)

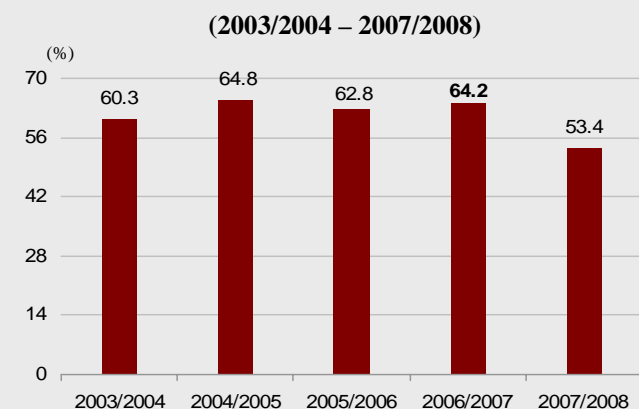

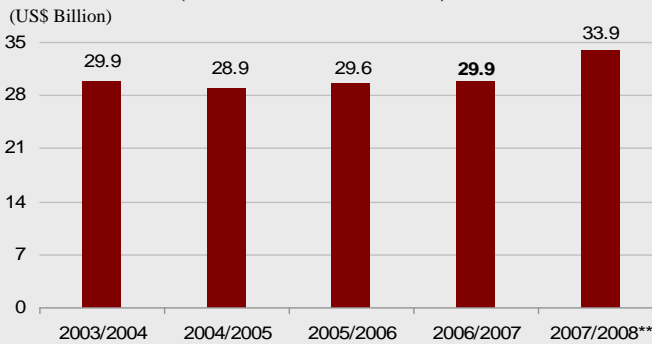

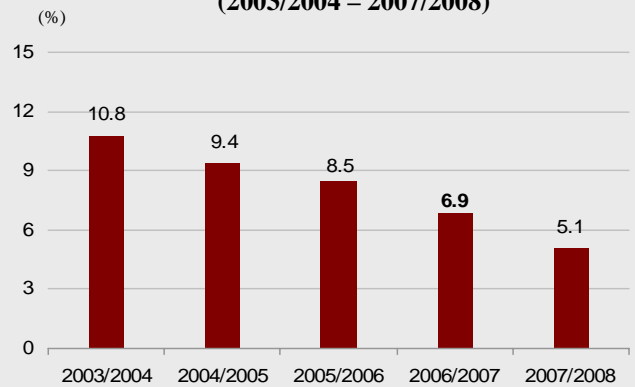

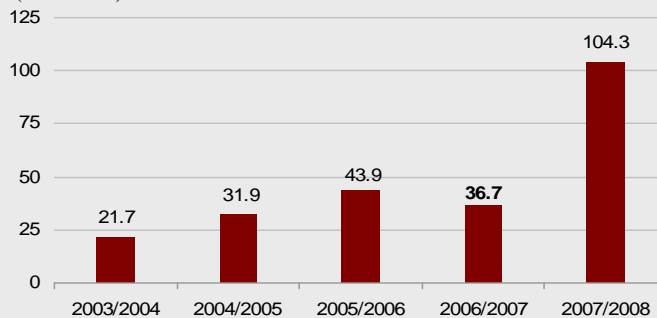

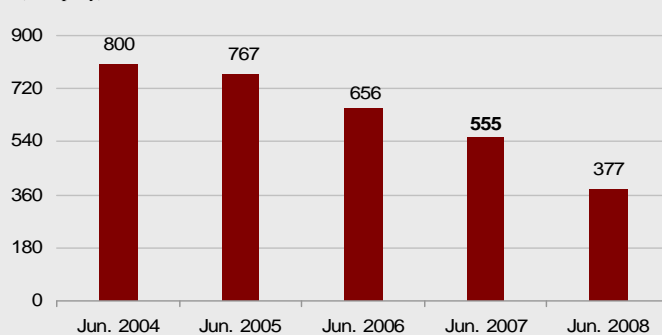

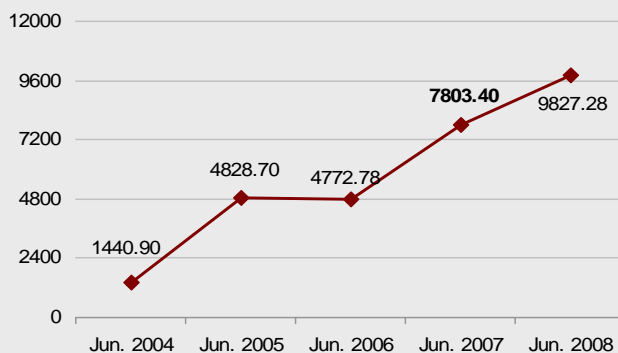

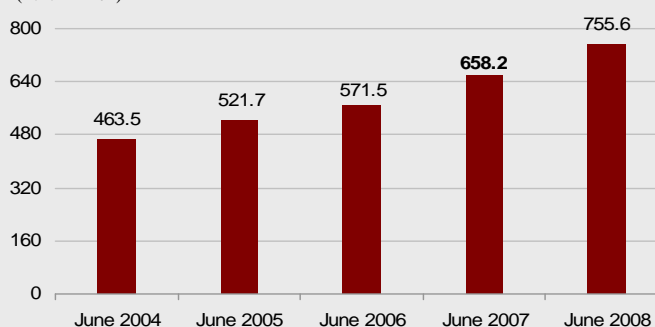

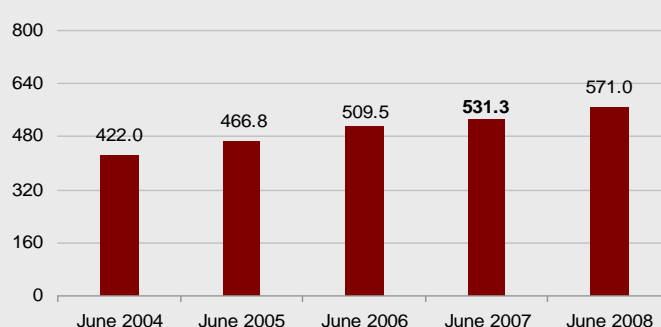

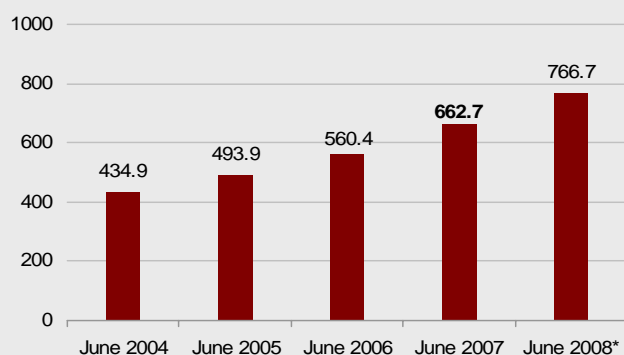
Domestic Liquidity (January 2008 - January 2009)

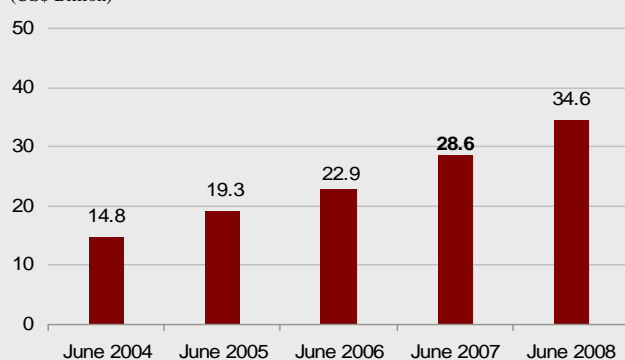

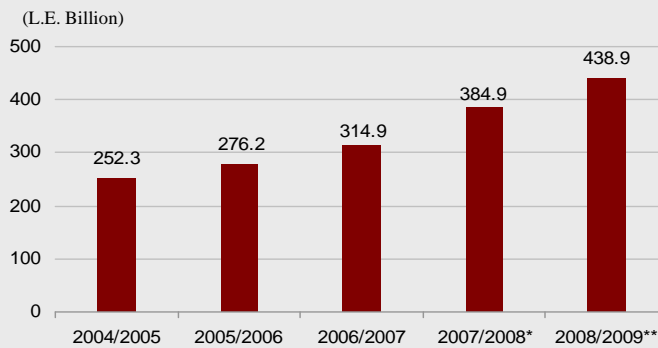

(2004/2005 – 2008/2009)

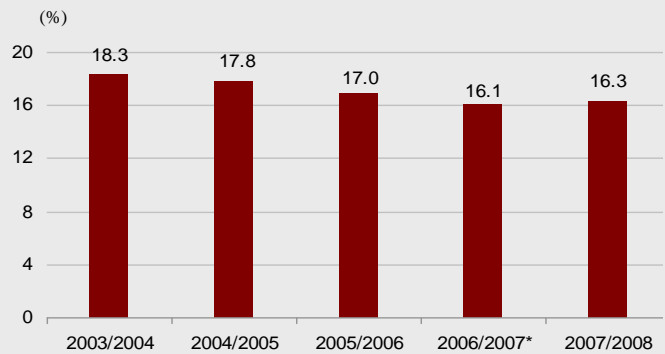

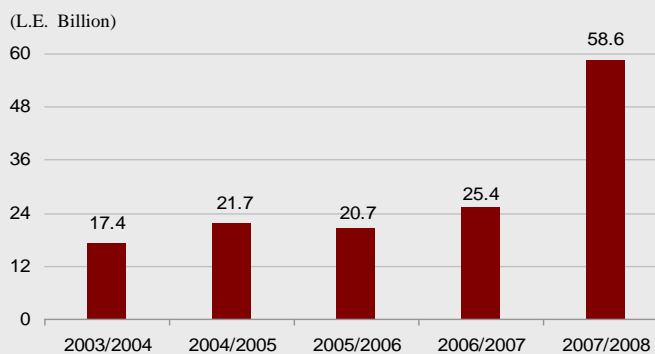
Industrial Sector Share in GDP

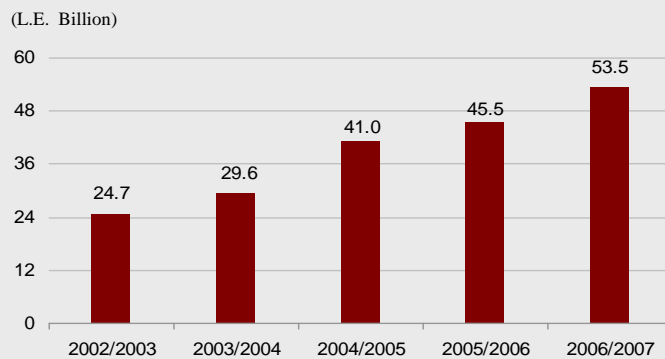
Industrial Exports*

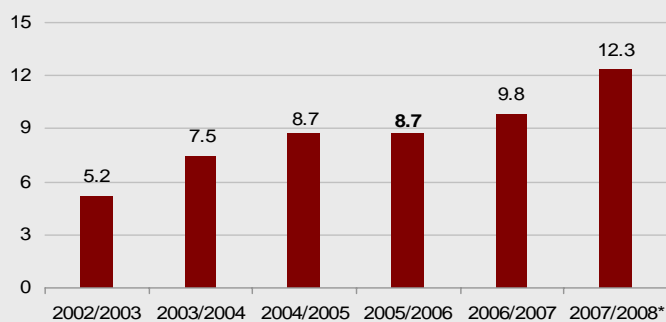

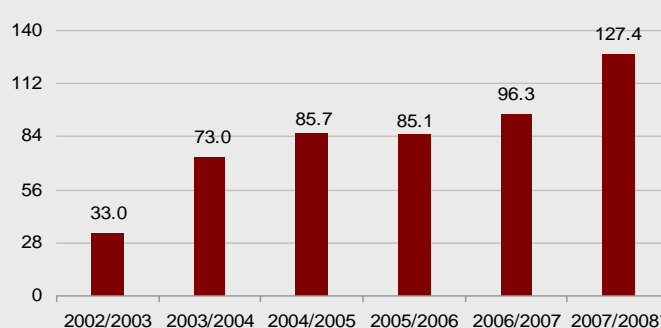

Total Tourism Revenues

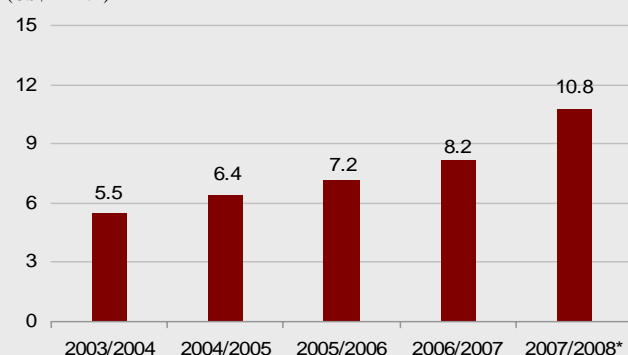

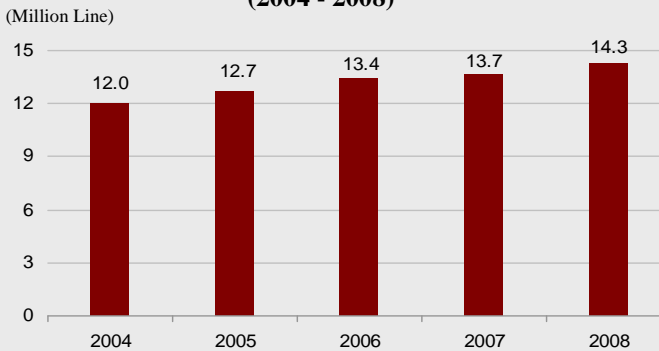

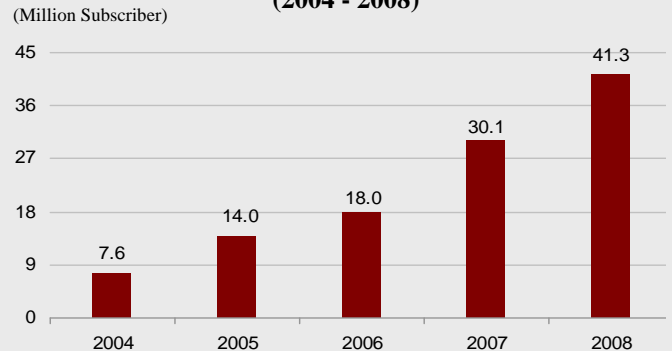

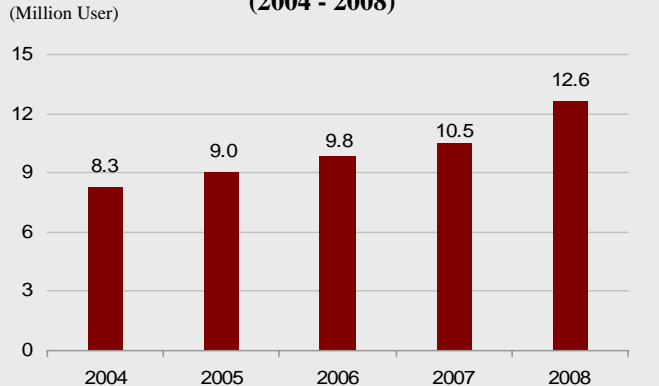

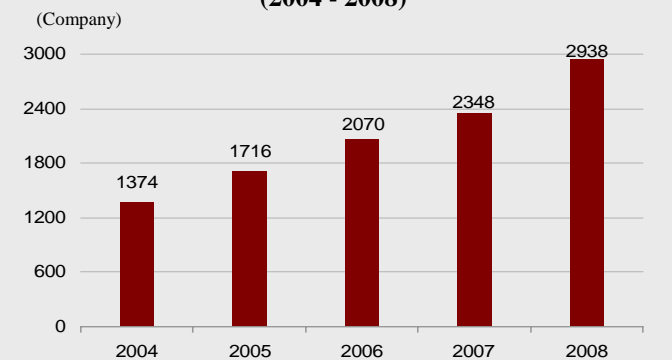

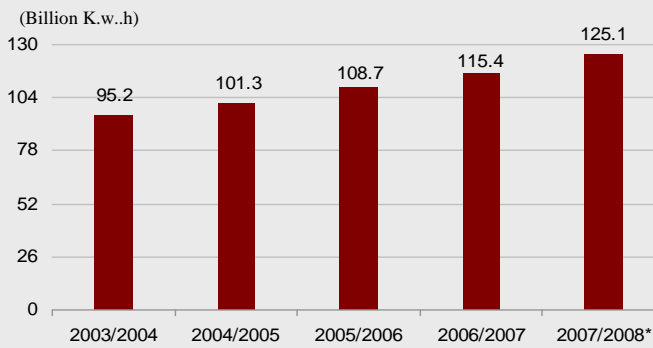

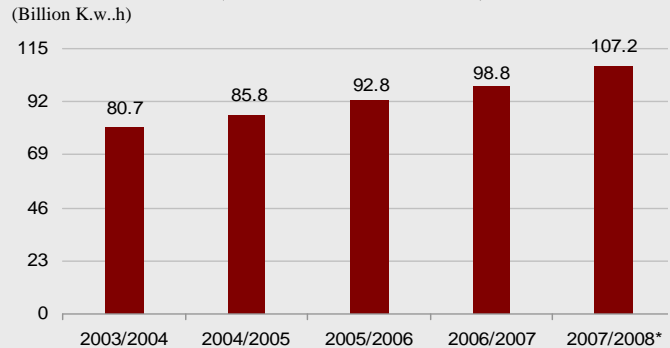

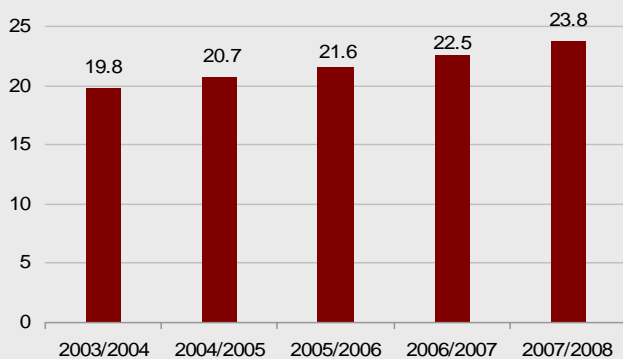

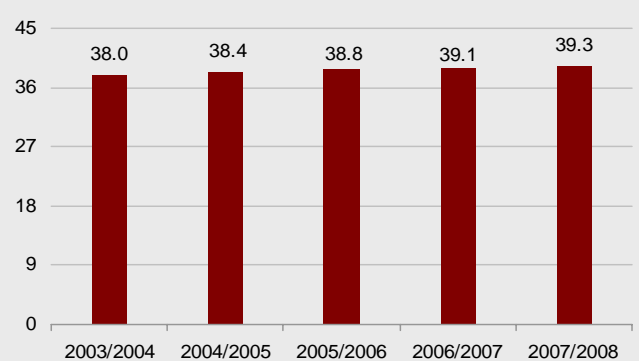

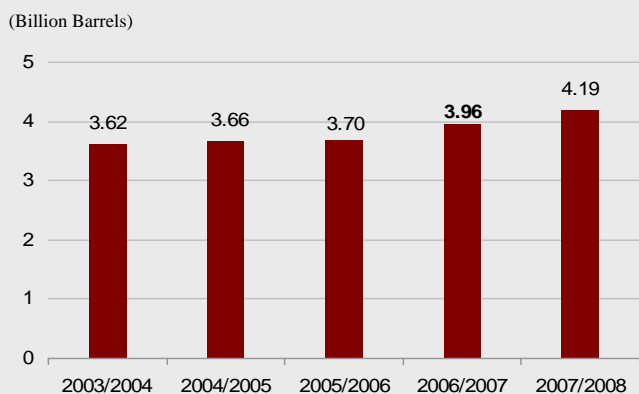

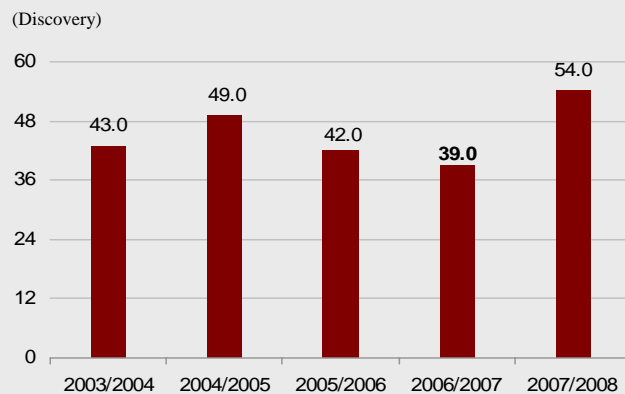

(2003/2004 – 2007/2008)**



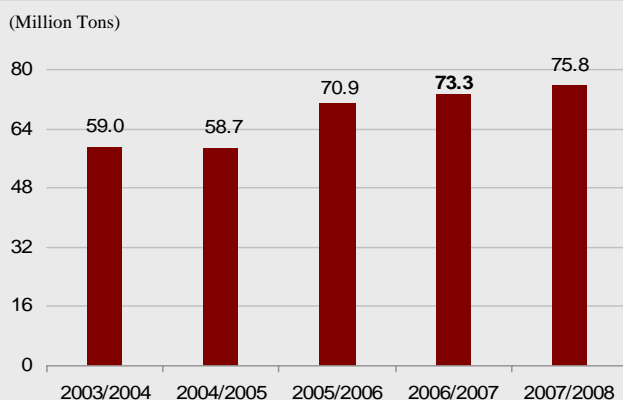

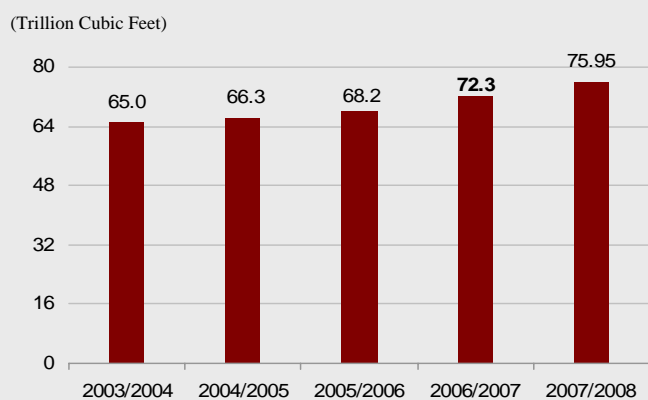

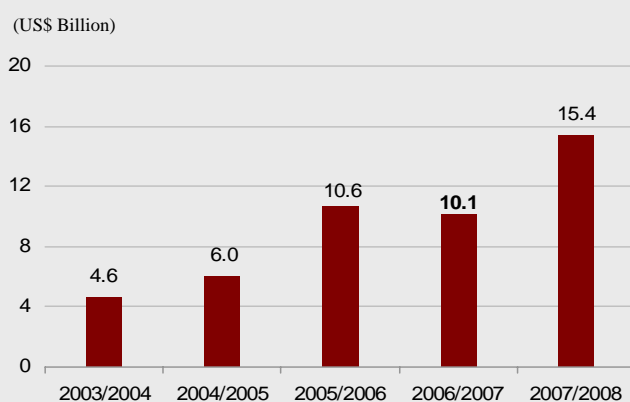
Remaining Accurate Reserves of Natural Gas *

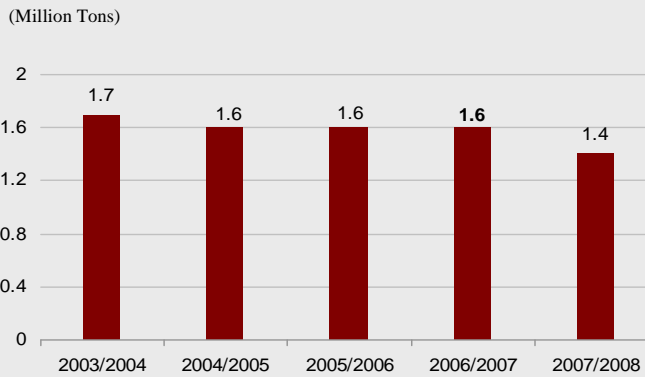

-  The total investment in the petroleum sector amounted to about US\$ 4.8 billion during the first half of year 2008/2009 of which about US\$ 4.1 billion was invested in the research and development of the foreign and joint companies; the rest was foreign direct investment in petrochemical projects.
-  220 thousand new housing units in different governorates, about 700 commercial customers, and about 60 factories were supplied with natural gas. Also 40 centers for the distribution of gas cylinders have been operating, to reach about 2642 centers during the second half of year 2008/2009.
-  8.6 thousand cars have been transferred to work with compressed natural gas, in addition two stations have been operated to supply cars with gas during the first half of year 2008/2009.

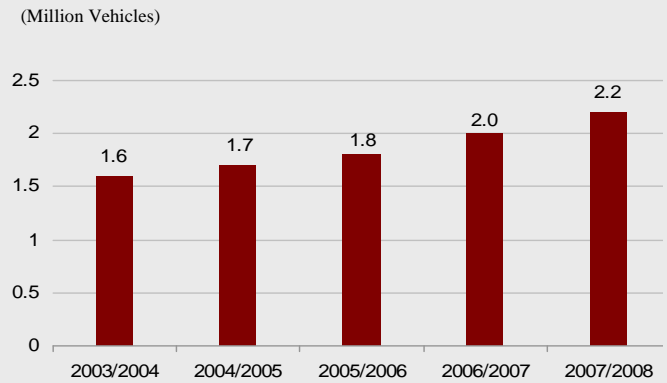

(2003/2004 – 2007/2008)



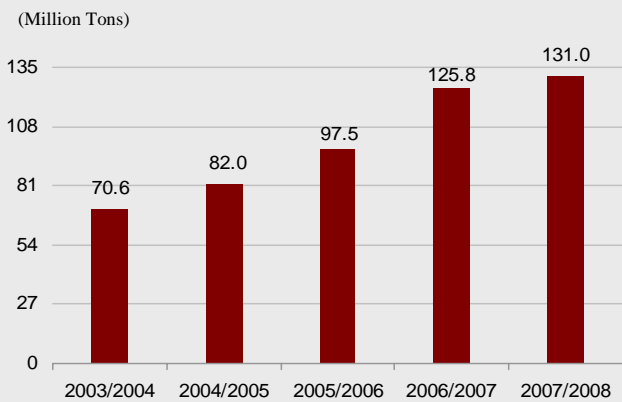

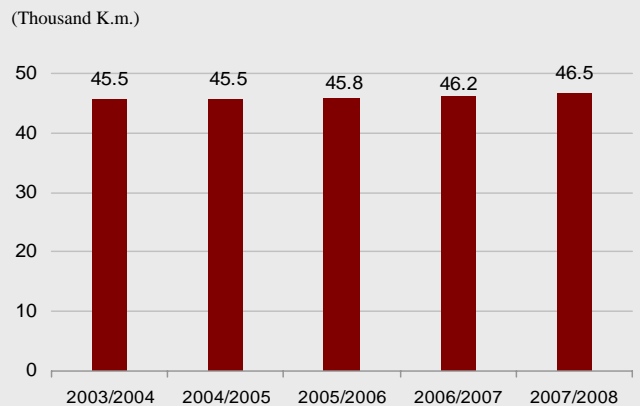

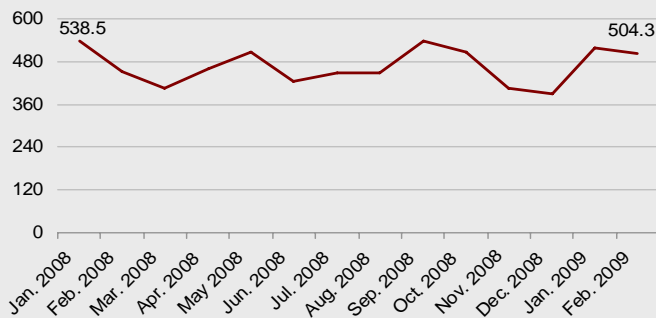

Steel Rebar Sales

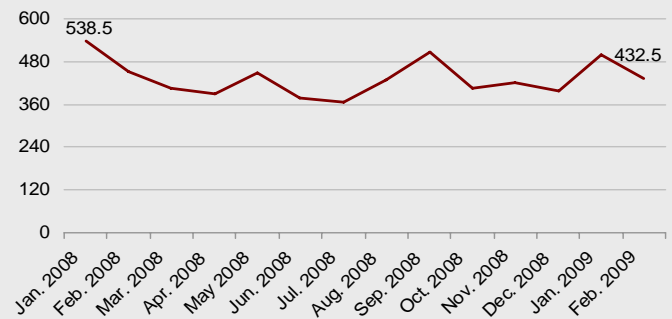

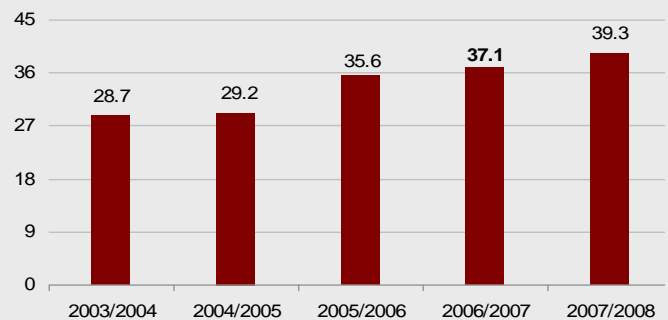

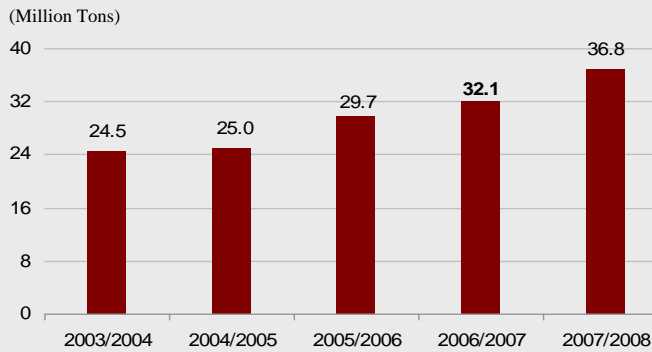

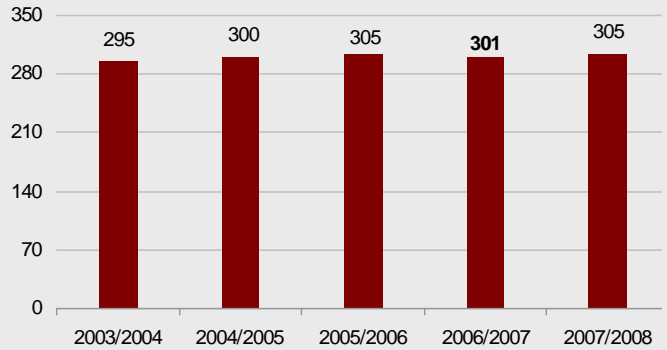

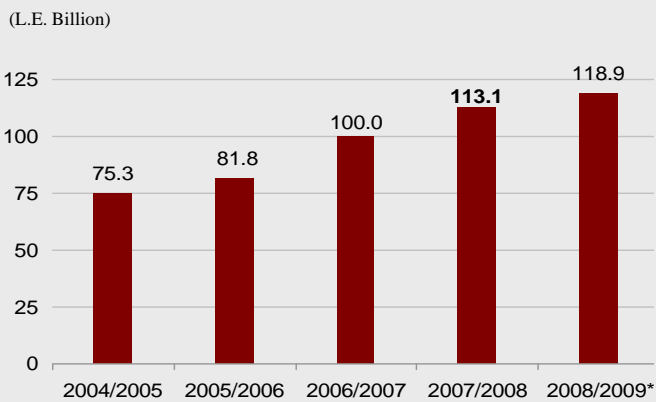

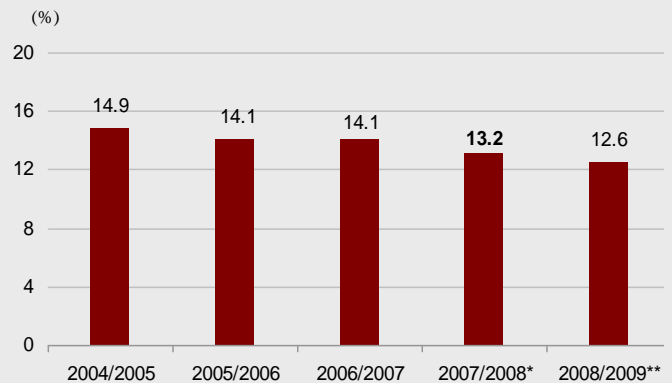
**Agriculture GDP “at factor cost and current prices”

current prices” (2004/2005 – 2008/2009)**

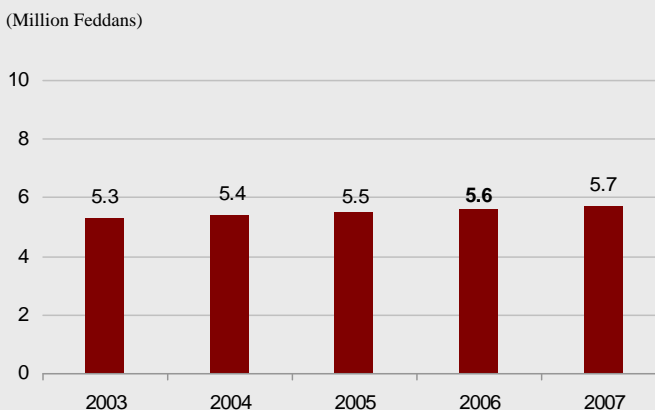

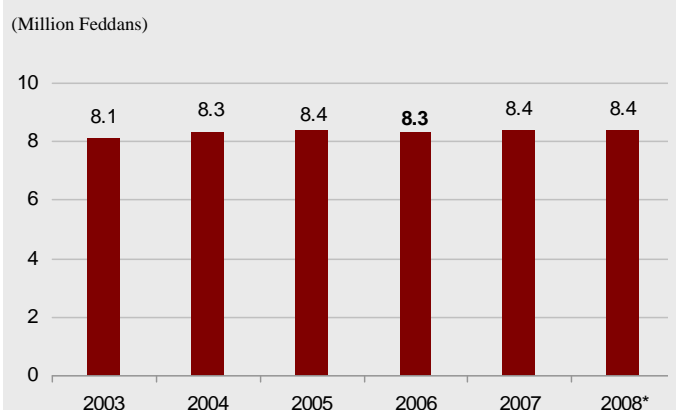

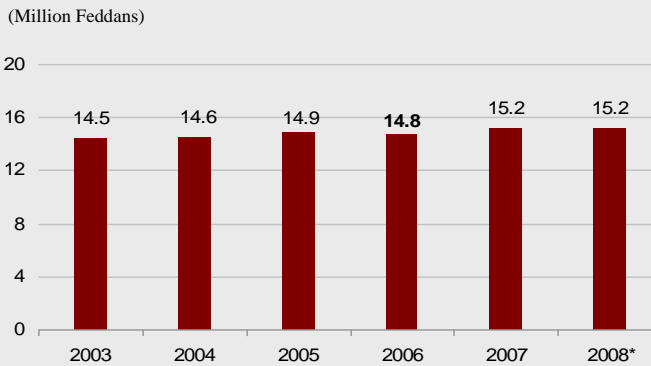

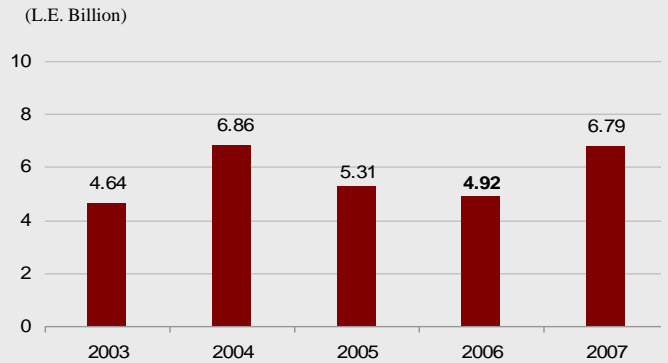
Cropped Area

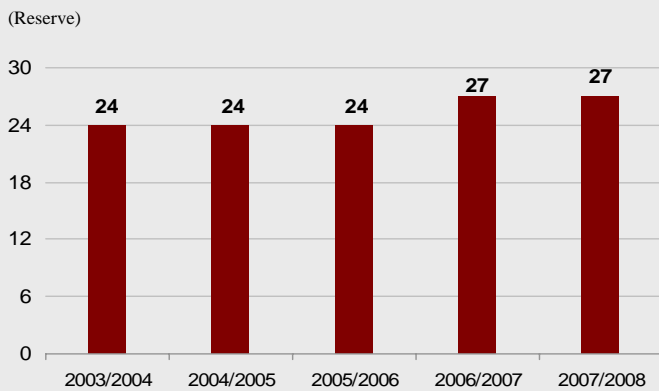

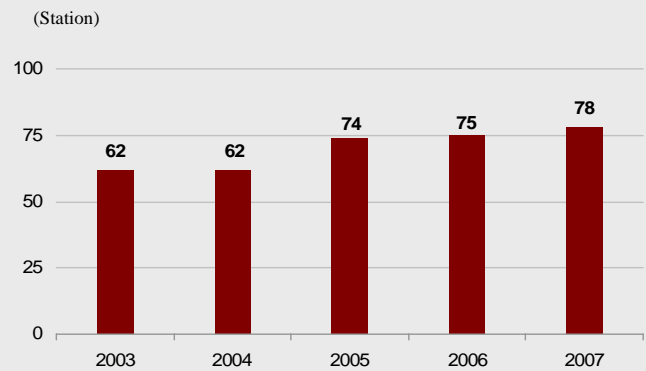

(2003/2004 – 2007/2008)**



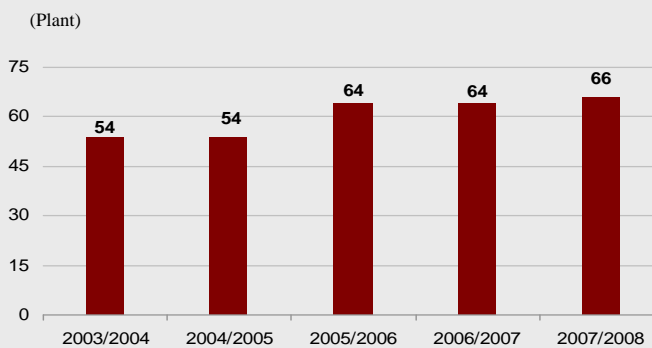

(2003 – 2007)**



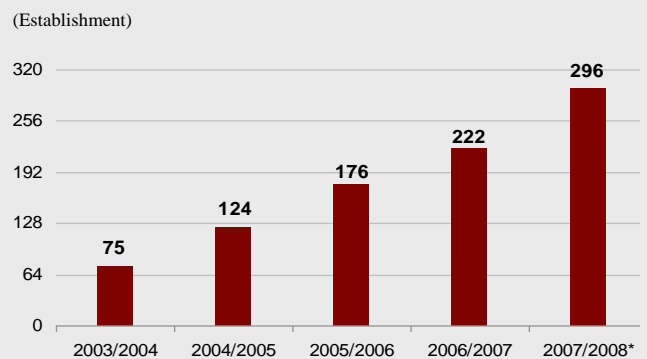

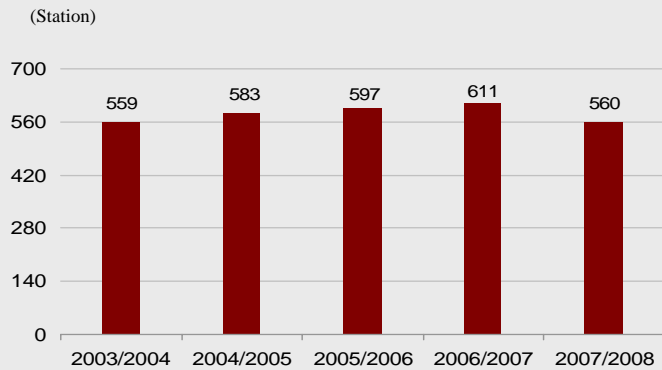

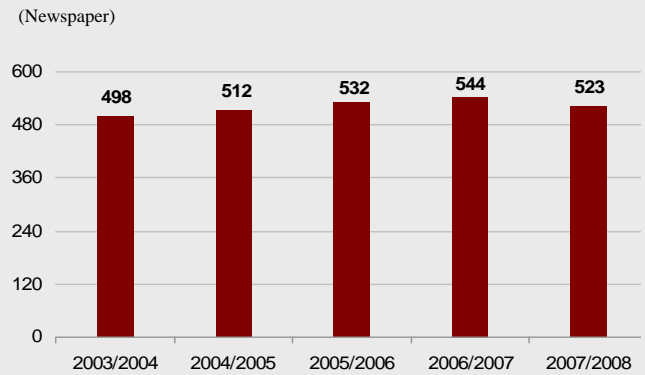

(2003/2004 – 2007/2008)



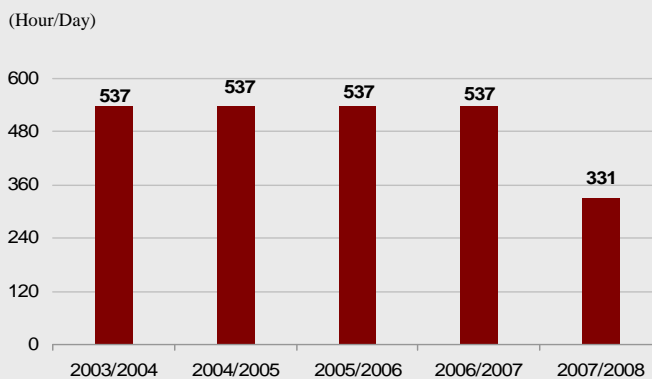

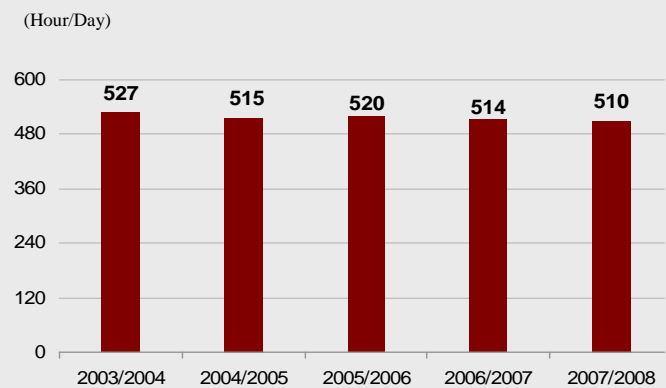

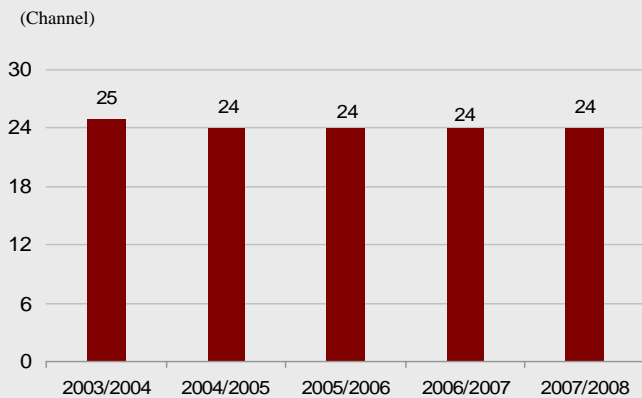

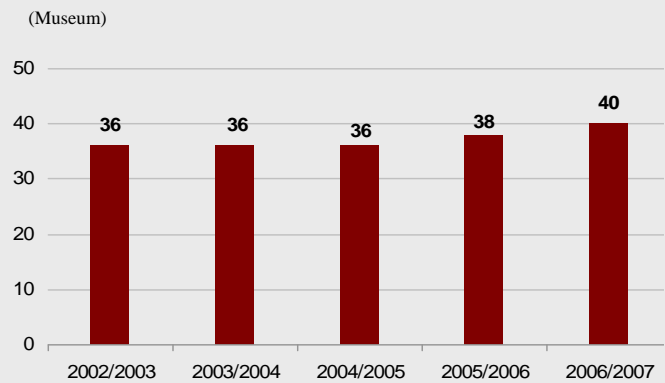

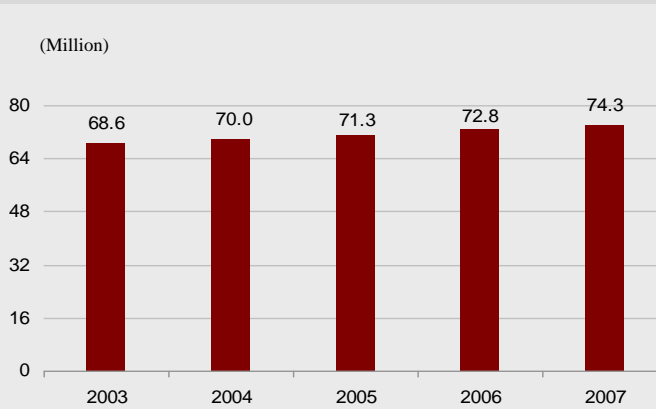

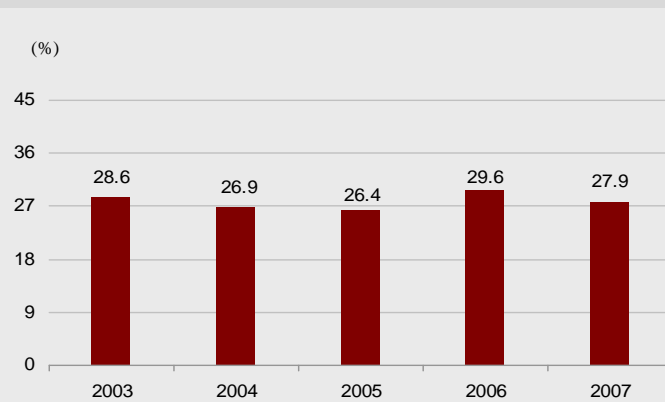

(2003 – 2007)**



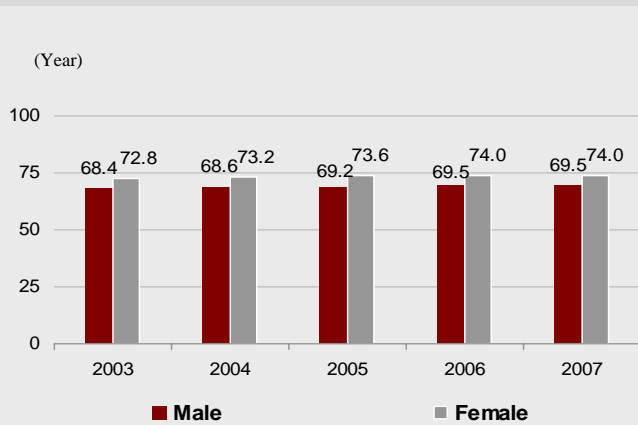

(2003 – 2007)**



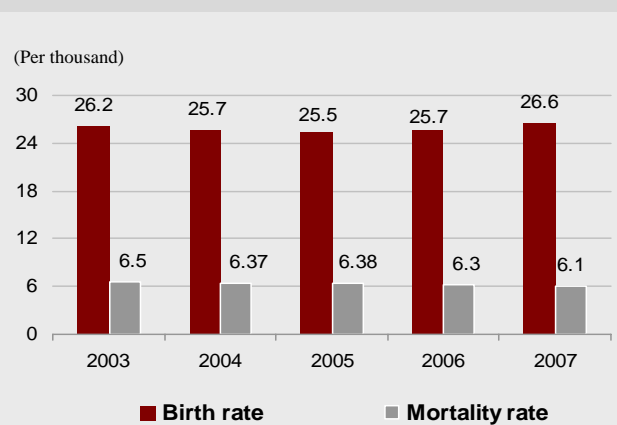

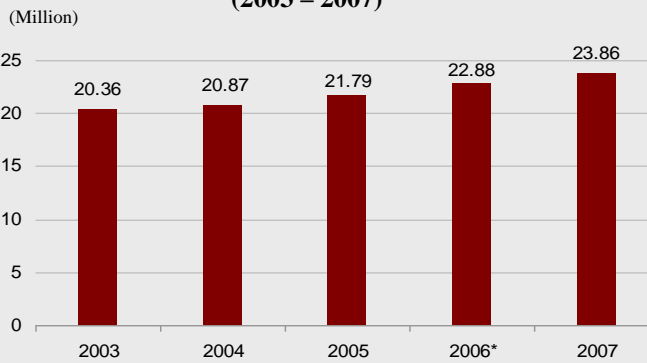

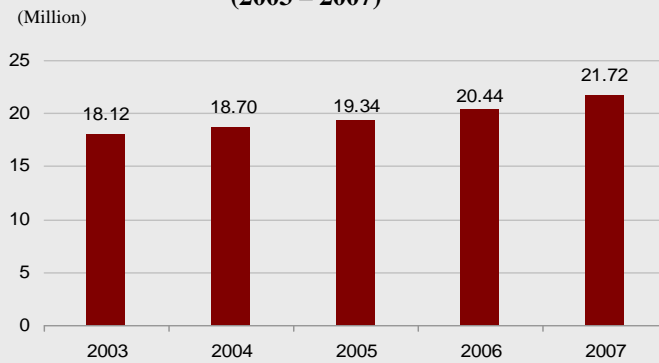

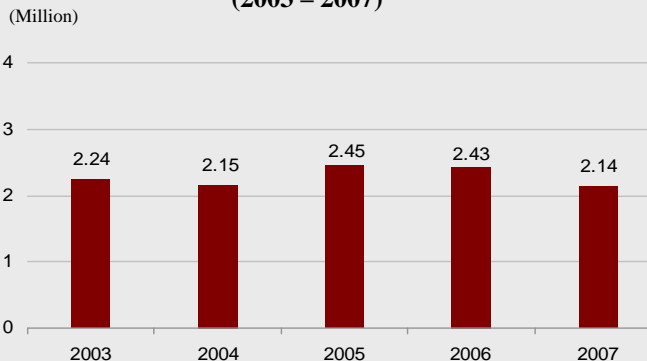
Number of Unemployed

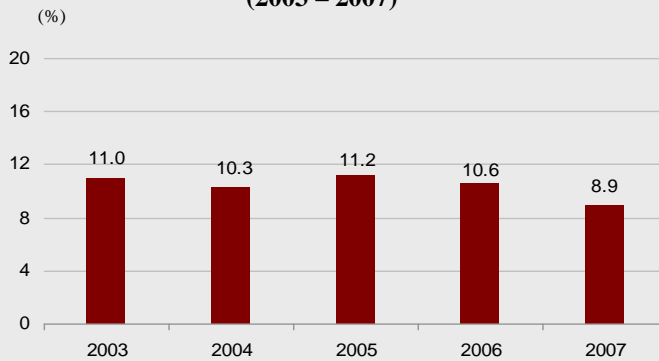
Unemployment Rate

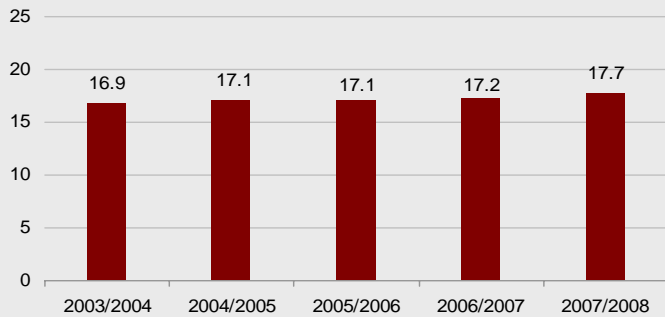

Total Number of Enrolled Students in pre- university Education (including Al Azhar) (2003/2004 – 2007/2008)

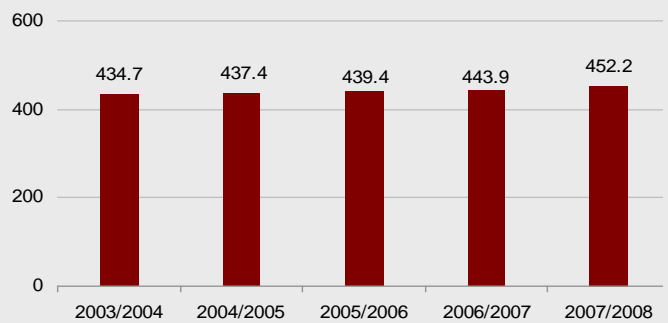

Number of Classrooms in pre-university education (including Al Azhar) (2003/2004 – 2007/2008)

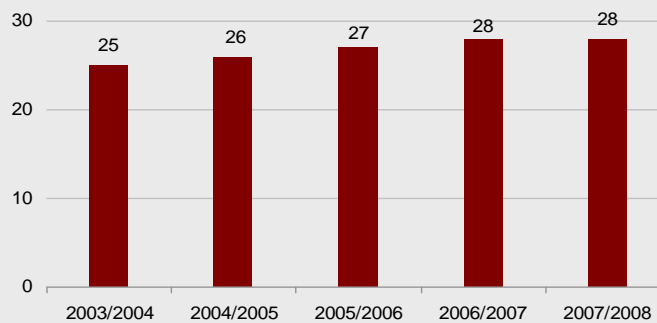

Rate of Students in higher and university Education (2003/2004 – 2007/2008)

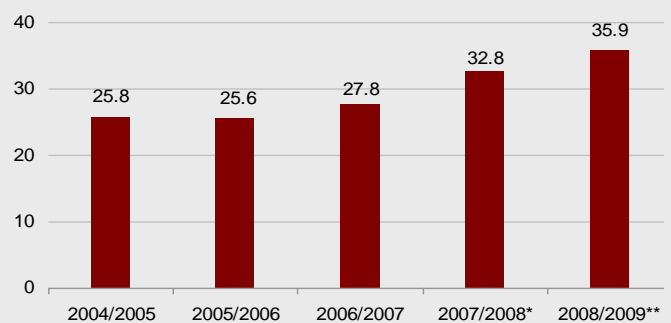

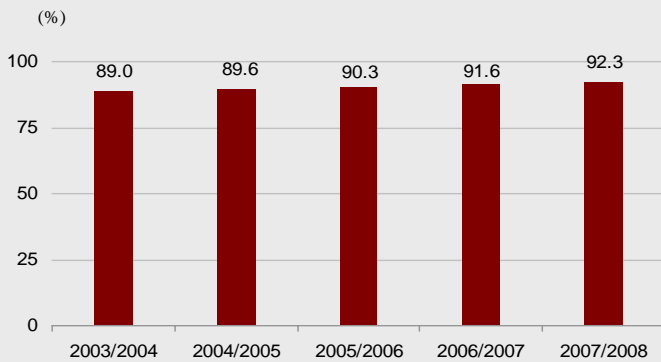

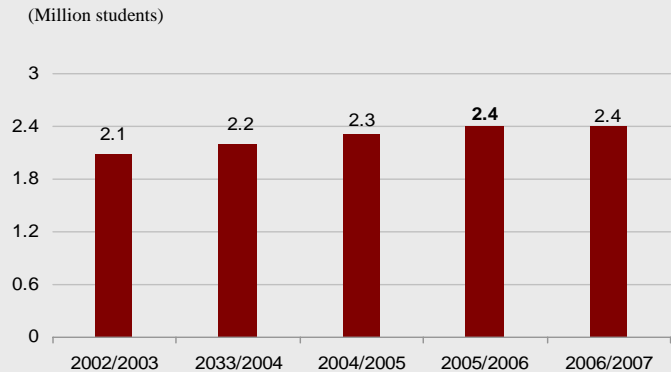

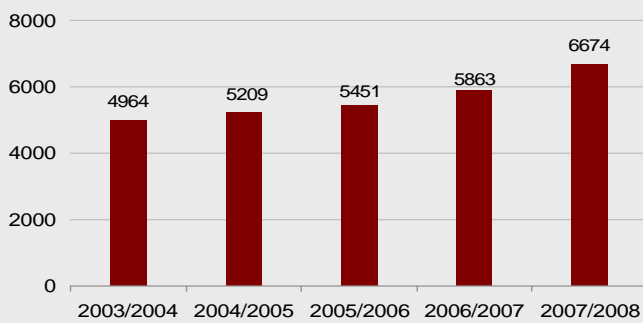

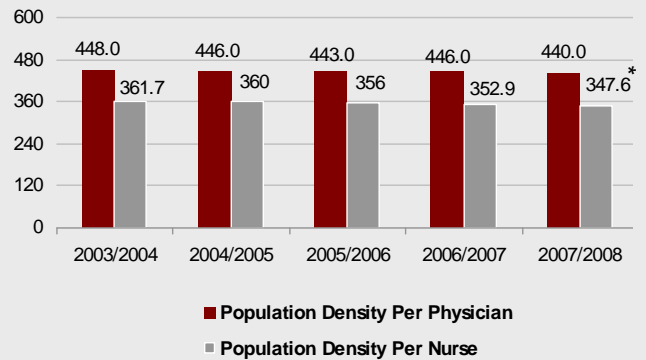

(Person per physician / nurse)

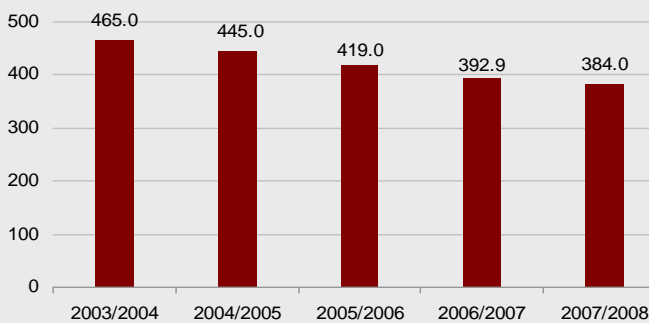

(2003/2004 – 2007/2008)**

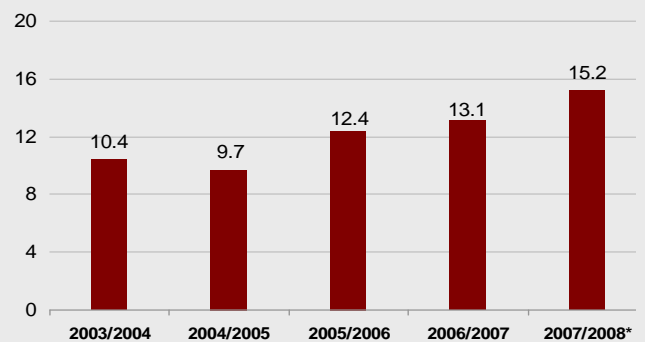

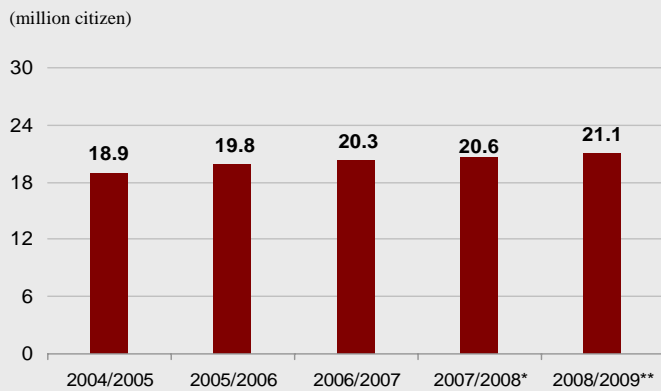

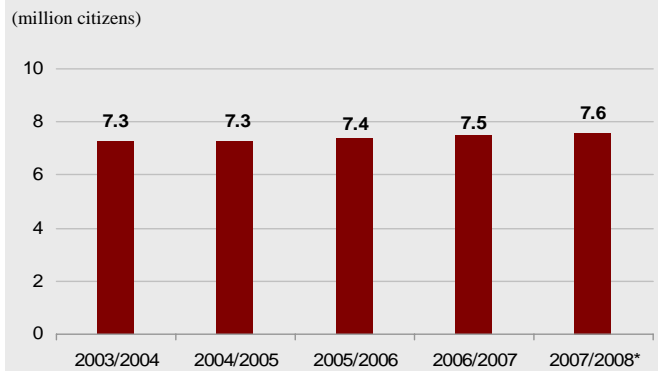
Number of Beneficiaries

(2003/2004 – 2007/2008)



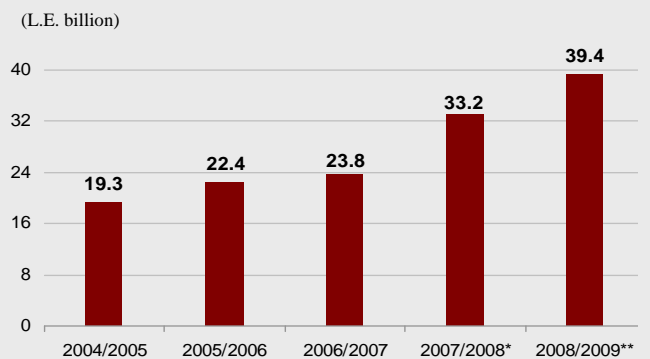
